**Current Work**

Rebecca is an information privacy, security and compliance consultant, author and instructor with her own company, Rebecca Herold, LLC. Rebecca has provided information security, privacy and compliance services to organizations in a wide range of industries throughout the world for over 17 years. In October 2007 Rebecca was named one of the "Best Privacy Advisers" in two of three categories by Computerworld magazine. Rebecca was also named one of the "Top 59 Influencers in IT Security" for 2007 by IT Security magazine. Rebecca is also an Adjunct Professor for the Norwich University Master of Science in Information Assurance (MSIA) program.

Rebecca was instrumental in building the information security and privacy program while at Principal Financial Group, which was awarded the 1998 CSI Information Security Program of the Year Award.
